

Word Study: Perfect

Strong's Greek Number 5046: teleios

complete (in various applications of labor, growth, mental and moral character, etc.); neuter (as noun, with 3588 (ho)) *completeness* :- of full age, man, perfect

Matthew 5:48 Be ye therefore *perfect*, even as your Father which is in heaven is *perfect*.

Matthew 19:21 Jesus said unto him, If thou wilt be *perfect*, go *and* sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come *and* follow me.

Romans 12:2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and *perfect*, will of God.

1 Corinthians 2:6 Howbeit we speak wisdom among them that are *perfect*: yet not the wisdom of this world, nor of the princes of this world, that come to nought:

1 Corinthians 13:10 But when that which is *perfect* is come, then that which is in part shall be done away.

1 Corinthians 14:20 Brethren, be not children in understanding: howbeit in malice be ye children, but in understanding be *men*.

Ephesians 4:13 Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a *perfect* man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:

Philippians 3:15 Let us therefore, as many as be *perfect*, be thus minded: and if in any thing ye be otherwise minded, God shall reveal even this unto you.

Colossians 1:28 Whom we preach, warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that we may present every man *perfect* in Christ Jesus:

Colossians 4:12 Epaphras, who is *one* of you, a servant of Christ, saluteth you, always labouring fervently for you in prayers, that ye may stand *perfect* and complete in all the will of God.

Hebrews 5:14 But strong meat belongeth to them that are of *full age*, *even* those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.

Hebrews 9:11 But Christ being come an high priest of good things to come, by a greater and more *perfect* tabernacle, not made with hands, that is to say, not of this building;

James 1:4 But let patience have *her perfect* work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.

James 1:17 Every good gift and every *perfect* gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.

James 1:25 But whoso looketh into the **perfect** law of liberty, and continueth *therein*, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed.

James 3:2 For in many things we offend all. If any man offend not in word, the same *is* a **perfect** man, *and* able also to bridle the whole body.

1 John 4:18 There is no fear in love; but **perfect** love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.

Strong's Greek Number 5047: teleiotēs

from <G5046> (teleios); (the state) *completeness* (mental or moral) :- perfection (-ness).

Colossians 3:14 And above all these things *put on* charity, which is the bond of **perfectness**.

Hebrews 6:1 Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto **perfection**; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God,

Strong's Greek Number 5048: teleioō

from <G5046> (teleios); to *complete*, i.e. (literal) *accomplish*, or (figurative) *consummate* (in character) :- consecrate, finish, fulfill, make) perfect.

Luke 2:43 And when they had **fulfilled** the days, as they returned, the child Jesus tarried behind in Jerusalem; and Joseph and his mother knew not *of it*.

Luke 13:32 And he said unto them, Go ye, and tell that fox, Behold, I cast out devils, and I do cures to day and to morrow, and the third *day* I shall be **perfected**.

John 4:34 Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to **finish** his work.

John 5:36 But I have greater witness than *that* of John: for the works which the Father hath given me to **finish**, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that the Father hath sent me.

John 17:4 I have glorified thee on the earth: I have **finished** the work which thou gavest me to do.

John 17:23 I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made **perfect** in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me.

John 19:28 After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the scripture might be **fulfilled**, saith, I thirst.

Acts 20:24 But none of these things move me, neither count I my life dear unto myself, so that I might **finish** my course with joy, and the ministry, which I have received of the Lord Jesus, to testify the gospel of the grace of God.

2 Corinthians 12:9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made **perfect** in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

Philippians 3:12 Not as though I had already attained, either were already *perfect*: but I follow after, if that I may apprehend that for which also I am apprehended of Christ Jesus.

Hebrews 2:10 For it became him, for whom *are* all things, and by whom *are* all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation *perfect* through sufferings.

Hebrews 5:9 And being made *perfect*, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him;

Hebrews 7:19 For the law made nothing *perfect*, but the bringing in of a better hope *did*; by the which we draw nigh unto God.

Hebrews 7:28 For the law maketh men high priests which have infirmity; but the word of the oath, which was since the law, *maketh* the Son, who is *consecrated* for evermore.

Hebrews 9:9 Which was a figure for the time then present, in which were offered both gifts and sacrifices, that could not make him that did the service *perfect*, as pertaining to the conscience;

Hebrews 10:1 For the law having a shadow of good things to come, *and* not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto *perfect*.

Hebrews 10:14 For by one offering he hath *perfected* for ever them that are sanctified.

Hebrews 11:40 God having provided some better thing for us, that they without us should not be made *perfect*.

Hebrews 12:23 To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made *perfect*,

James 2:22 Seest thou how faith wrought with his works, and by works was faith made *perfect*?

1 John 2:5 But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God *perfected*: hereby know we that we are in him.

1 John 4:12 No man hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is *perfected* in us.

1 John 4:17-18 Herein is our love made *perfect*, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made *perfect* in love.

Strong's Greek Number 5049: teleiōs

adverb from <G5046> (teleios); *completely*, i.e. (of hope) *without wavering* :- to the end.

1 Peter 1:13

¹³Wherefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and hope *to the end* for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of Jesus Christ;

Strong's Greek Number 5050: teleiōsis

from <G5448> (phusioo); (the act) *completion*, i.e. (of prophecy) *verification*, or (of expiation) *absolution* :- perfection, performance.

Luke 1:45 And blessed *is* she that believed: for there shall be a **performance** of those things which were told her from the Lord.

Hebrews 7:11 If therefore **perfection** were by the Levitical priesthood, (for under it the people received the law,) what further need *was there* that another priest should rise after the order of Melchisedec, and not be called after the order of Aaron?

Strong's Greek Number 5051: teleiōtēs

from <G5048> (teleioo); a *completer*, i.e. *consummator* :- finisher.

Hebrews 12:2 Looking unto Jesus the author and **finisher** of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Strong's Greek Number 5052: telesphoreō

from a compound of <G5056> (telos) and <G5342> (phero); to *be a bearer to completion* (maturity), i.e. to *ripen* fruit (figurative) :- bring fruit to perfection.

Luke 8:14 And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of *this* life, and bring no fruit to **perfection**.

Strong's Greek Number 5053: teleutaō

from a presumed derivative of <G5055> (teleo); to *finish* life (by implication of <G979> (bios)), i.e. *expire* (*demise*) :- be dead, decease, die.

Matthew 2:19 But when Herod was **dead**, behold, an angel of the Lord appeareth in a dream to Joseph in Egypt,

Matthew 9:18 While he spake these things unto them, behold, there came a certain ruler, and worshipped him, saying, My daughter is even now **dead**: but come and lay thy hand upon her, and she shall live.

Matthew 15:4 For God commanded, saying, Honour thy father and mother: and, He that curseth father or mother, let him **die** the death.

Matthew 22:25 Now there were with us seven brethren: and the first, when he had married a wife, **deceased**, and, having no issue, left his wife unto his brother:

Mark 7:10 For Moses said, Honour thy father and thy mother; and, Whoso curseth father or mother, let him **die** the death:

Mark 9:44 Where their worm **dieth** not, and the fire is not quenched.

Mark 9:46 Where their worm **dieth** not, and the fire is not quenched.

Mark 9:48 Where their worm *dieth* not, and the fire is not quenched.

Luke 7:2 And a certain centurion's servant, who was dear unto him, was sick, and ready to *die*.

Acts 2:29 Men *and* brethren, let me freely speak unto you of the patriarch David, that he is both *dead* and buried, and his sepulchre is with us unto this day.

Acts 7:15 So Jacob went down into Egypt, and *died*, he, and our fathers,

Hebrews 11:22 By faith Joseph, when he *died*, made mention of the departing of the children of Israel; and gave commandment concerning his bones.

Strong's Greek Number 5054: teleutē from <G5053> (teleutao); *decease* :- death.

Matthew 2:15 And was there until the *death* of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Out of Egypt have I called my son.

Strong's Greek Number 2055: teleō from <G5056> (telos); to *end*, i.e. *complete, execute, conclude, discharge* (a debt) :- accomplish, make an end, expire, fill up, finish, go over, pay, perform.

Matthew 10:23 But when they persecute you in this city, flee ye into another: for verily I say unto you, Ye shall not *have gone over* the cities of Israel, till the Son of man be come.

Matthew 11:1 And it came to pass, when Jesus *had made an end* of commanding his twelve disciples, he departed thence to teach and to preach in their cities.

Matthew 13:53 And it came to pass, *that* when Jesus had *finished* these parables, he departed thence.

Matthew 17:24 And when they were come to Capernaum, they that received tribute *money* came to Peter, and said, Doth not your master *pay* tribute?

Matthew 19:1 And it came to pass, *that* when Jesus *had finished* these sayings, he departed from Galilee, and came into the coasts of Judaea beyond Jordan;

Matthew 26:1 And it came to pass, when Jesus *had finished* all these sayings, he said unto his disciples,

Luke 2:39 And when they *had performed* all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own city Nazareth.

Luke 12:50 But I have a baptism to be baptized with; and how am I straitened till it be *accomplished!*

Luke 18:31 Then he took *unto him* the twelve, and said unto them, Behold, we go up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of man *shall be accomplished*.

Luke 22:37 For I say unto you, that this that is written must yet be *accomplished* in me, And he was reckoned among the transgressors: for the things concerning me have an end.

John 19:28 After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now **accomplished**, that the scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst.

John 19:30 When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is **finished**: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost.

Acts 13:29 And when they had **fulfilled** all that was written of him, they took *him* down from the tree, and laid *him* in a sepulchre.

Romans 2:27 And shall not uncircumcision which is by nature, if it **fulfil** the law, judge thee, who by the letter and circumcision dost transgress the law?

Romans 13:6 For for this cause **pay** ye tribute also: for they are God's ministers, attending continually upon this very thing.

Galatians 5:16 *This* I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not **fulfil** the lust of the flesh.

2 Timothy 4:7 I have fought a good fight, I have **finished** my course, I have kept the faith:

James 2:8 If ye **fulfil** the royal law according to the scripture, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself, ye do well:

Revelation 10:7 But in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, when he shall begin to sound, the mystery of God should be **finished**, as he hath declared to his servants the prophets.

Revelation 11:7 And when they shall have **finished** their testimony, the beast that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit shall make war against them, and shall overcome them, and kill them.

Revelation 15:1 And I saw another sign in heaven, great and marvellous, seven angels having the seven last plagues; for in them is **filled up** the wrath of God.

Revelation 15:8 And the temple was filled with smoke from the glory of God, and from his power; and no man was able to enter into the temple, till the seven plagues of the seven angels were **fulfilled**.

Revelation 17:17 For God hath put in their hearts to fulfil his will, and to agree, and give their kingdom unto the beast, until the words of God **shall be fulfilled**.

Revelation 20:3 And cast him into the bottomless pit, and shut him up, and set a seal upon him, that he should deceive the nations no more, till the thousand years should be **fulfilled**: and after that he must be loosed a little season.

Revelation 20:5 But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were **finished**. This *is* the first resurrection.

Revelation 20:7 And when the thousand years are **expired**, Satan shall be loosed out of his prison,

Strong's Greek Number 5056: telos

from a primary *tello* (to *set out* for a definite point or *goal*); properly the point aimed at as a *limit*, i.e. (by implication) the *conclusion* of an act or state (*termination* [literal, figurative or indefinite], *result* [immediate, ultimate or prophetic], *purpose*); specially an *impost* or *levy* (as *paid*) :- + continual, custom, end (-ing), finally, uttermost. Compare <G5411> (phoros).

Matthew 10:22 And ye shall be hated of all *men* for my name's sake: but he that endureth to the **end** shall be saved.

Matthew 17:25 He saith, Yes. And when he was come into the house, Jesus prevented him, saying, What thinkest thou, Simon? of whom do the kings of the earth take **custom** or tribute? of their own children, or of strangers?

Matthew 24:6 And ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all *these things* must come to pass, but the **end** is not yet.

Matthew 24:13-14 But he that shall endure unto the **end**, the same shall be saved.¹⁴ And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the **end** come.

Matthew 26:58 But Peter followed him afar off unto the high priest's palace, and went in, and sat with the servants, to see the **end**.

Mark 3:26 And if Satan rise up against himself, and be divided, he cannot stand, but hath an **end**.

Mark 13:7 And when ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars, be ye not troubled: for *such things* must needs be; but the **end** shall not be yet.

Mark 13:13 And ye shall be hated of all *men* for my name's sake: but he that shall endure unto the **end**, the same shall be saved.

Luke 1:33 And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no **end**.

Luke 18:5 Yet because this widow troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming (*lit. unto the end*) she weary me.

Luke 21:9 But when ye shall hear of wars and commotions, be not terrified: for these things must first come to pass; but the **end** is not by and by.

Luke 22:37 For I say unto you, that this that is written must yet be accomplished in me, And he was reckoned among the transgressors: for the things concerning me have an **end**.

John 13:1 Now before the feast of the passover, when Jesus knew that his hour was come that he should depart out of this world unto the Father, having loved his own which were in the world, he loved them unto the **end**.

Romans 6:21-22 What fruit had ye then in those things whereof ye are now ashamed? for the **end** of those things *is* death.²² But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the **end** everlasting life.

Romans 10:4 For Christ *is* the **end** of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth.

Romans 13:7 Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute *is due*; **custom** to whom **custom**; fear to whom fear; honour to whom honour.

1 Corinthians 1:8 Who shall also confirm you unto the **end**, *that ye may be* blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Corinthians 10:11 Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the **ends** of the world are come.

1 Corinthians 15:24 Then *cometh* the **end**, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power.

2 Corinthians 1:13 For we write none other things unto you, than what ye read or acknowledge; and I trust ye shall acknowledge even to the **end**;

2 Corinthians 3:13 And not as Moses, *which* put a vail over his face, that the children of Israel could not stedfastly look to the **end** of that which is abolished:

2 Corinthians 11:15 Therefore *it is* no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose **end** shall be according to their works.

Philippians 3:19 Whose **end** *is* destruction, whose God *is their* belly, and *whose* glory *is* in their shame, who mind earthly things.)

1 Thessalonians 2:16 Forbidding us to speak to the Gentiles that they might be saved, to fill up their sins alway: for the wrath *is* come upon them to the **uttermost**.

1 Timothy 1:5 Now the **end** of the commandment *is* charity out of a pure heart, and *of* a good conscience, and *of* faith unfeigned:

Hebrews 3:6 But Christ as a son over his own house; whose house are we, if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm unto the **end**.

Hebrews 3:14 For we are made partakers of Christ, if we hold the beginning of our confidence stedfast unto the **end**;

Hebrews 6:8 But that which beareth thorns and briers *is* rejected, and *is* nigh unto cursing; whose end *is* to be burned.

Hebrews 6:11 And we desire that every one of you do shew the same diligence to the full assurance of hope unto the **end**:

Hebrews 7:3 Without father, without mother, without descent, having neither beginning of days, nor **end** of life; but made like unto the Son of God; abideth a priest continually.

James 5:11 Behold, we count them happy which endure. Ye have heard of the patience of Job, and have seen the **end** of the Lord; that the Lord is very pitiful, and of tender mercy.

1 Peter 1:9 Receiving the **end** of your faith, *even* the salvation of *your* souls.

1 Peter 3:8 **Finally**, *be ye* all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, *be* pitiful, *be* courteous:

1 Peter 4:7 But the **end** of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer.

1 Peter 4:17 For the time *is come* that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if *it* first *begin* at us, what shall the **end** *be* of them that obey not the gospel of God?

Revelation 1:8 I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the **ending**, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty.

Revelation 2:26 And he that overcometh, and keepeth my works unto the **end**, to him will I give power over the nations:

Revelation 21:6 And he said unto me, It is done. I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the **end**. I will give unto him that is athirst of the fountain of the water of life freely.

Revelation 22:13 I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the **end**, the first and the last.
