Envy/Envying/Envyings

Hebrew Strong's Number: 7068 qin'â

Root: from <H7065>

Part of Speech: n f

from <H7065> (qana'); *jealousy or envy* :-
envy (-ied), jealousy, × sake, zeal

Job 5:2 For wrath killeth the foolish man, and **envy** slayeth the silly one.

Proverbs 14:30 A sound heart *is* the life of the flesh: but **envy** the rottenness of the bones.

Proverbs 27:4 Wrath *is* cruel, and anger *is* outrageous; but who *is* able to stand before **envy**?
