

2850. **κολακεία** *kólakēia*, *kol-ak'-ah*; from a der. of **κόλαξ** *kólax* (a *flatterer*); *flattery*;—X *flattering*.

2851. **κόλασις** *kólasis*, *kol'-as-is*; from **ἀεφ**; *penal infliction*;—*punishment, torment*.

2852. **κολαφίζω** *kólaphizō*, *kol-af-id'-zo*; from a der. of the base of **ἀεφ**; to *rap* with the fist;—*buffet*.

2853. **κόλλω** *kólloō*, *kol-lah'-o*; from **κόλλα** *kóllassa* ("glue"); to *glue*, i.e. (pass. or reflex.) to *stick* (fig.);—*cleave, join (self), keep company*.

2854. **κολλούριον** *kólloúriōn*, *kol-loo'-ree-on*; neut. of a presumed der. of **κόλλω** *kólloō* (a *cake*; prob. akin to the base of **ἀεφ**); prop. a *poultice* (as made of or in the form of *crackers*), i.e. (by anal.) a *plaster*;—*eyesalve*.

2855. **κολλυβιστής** *kóllybistēs*, *kol-loo-bis-tas*; from a presumed der. of **κόλλω** *kólloō* (*dealers* (a small *coin*; prob. akin to **ἀεφ**); a *coin-dealer*);—(*money*) *changer*.

2856. **κολοβός** *kólōbōs*, *kol-ob-ō'-o*; from a der. of the base of **ἀεφ**; to *dock*, i.e. (fig.) *abridge*;—*shorten*.

2857. **Κολοσσαί** *Kólōssai*, *kol-os-sah'-ee*; appar. fem. plur. of **κολοσσός** *kólōssōs* ("colossal"); *Colossae*, a place in Asia Minor;—*Colosse*.

2858. **Κολοσσαεύς** *Kólōssaeus*, *kol-os-say-oo-s*; fr. **ἀεφ**; a *Colossaeon*, i.e. inh. of Colossae;—*Colossian*.

2859. **κόλωτος** *kólōtos*, *kol'-pos*; appar. a prim. word; the *bosom*; by anal. a *day*;—*bosom, creek*.

2860. **κολυμβάω** *kólumbāō*, *kol-oom-bah'-o*; from **κόλυμβος** *kólumbōs* (a *diver*); to *plunge* into water;—*swim*.

2861. **κολυμβήθρα** *kólumbēthra*, *kol-oom-bay'-thrah*; from **ἀεφ**; a *diving-place*, i.e. *pond* for bathing (or swimming);—*pool*.

2862. **κόλωνία** *kólōnia*, *kol-o-nee'-ah*; of Lat. or.; a Roman "*colony*" for veterans;—*colony*.

2863. **κομάω** *kómāō*, *kom-ah'-o*; from **ἀεφ**; to *wear tresses* of hair;—*have long hair*.

2864. **κόμη** *kómē*, *kom'-ay*; appar. from the same as **ἀεφ**; the *hair* of the head (*locks*, as *ornamental*), and thus differing from **ἀεφ**, which prop. denotes merely the *scalp*;—*hair*.

2865. **κομίζω** *kómizō*, *kom-id'-zo*; from a prim. **κομῆ** *kómē* (to *tend*, i.e. take care of); prop. to *provide* for, i.e. (by impl.) to *carry off* (as if from *harm*; gen. *obtain*);—*bring, receive*.

2866. **κομψότερον** *kómpsychōteron*, *kom-psot'-er-on*; neut. compar. of a der. of the base of **ἀεφ** (mean. prop. *well dressed*, i.e. *nice*); fig. *convalescent*;—*to began to amend*.

2867. **κομῖα** *kómia*, *kon-ee-ah'-o*; from **κομῖα** *kómia* (*dust*; by anal. *lime*); to *whitewash*;—*whiten*.

2868. **κομπούριος** *kómboúrios*, *kon-ee-or-tos*; from the base of **ἀεφ** and **ὄρνυμι** *órnyumi* (to "*rouse*"); *pulverulence* (as *blown about*);—*dust*.

2869. **κοπῆ** *kópē*, *kop-ad'-zo*; from **ἀεφ**; to *tire*, i.e. (fig.) to *relax*;—*cease*.

2870. **κοπτός** *kóptōs*, *kop-et-os*; from **ἀεφ**; *mourning* (prop. by *beating* the breast);—*lamentation*.

2871. **κοπή** *kópē*, *kop-ay'*; from **ἀεφ**; *cutting*, i.e. *carriage*;—*slaughter*.

2872. **κοπιῶ** *kópiō*, *kop-ee-ah'-o*; from a der. of **ἀεφ**; to *feel fatigue*; by impl. to *work hard*;—(*bestow*) *labour, toil, be wearied*.

2873. **κόπος** *kópos*, *kop-os*; from **ἀεφ**; a *cut*, i.e. (by anal.) *toil* (as *reducing* the strength), lit. or fig.; by impl. *pains*;—*labour, + trouble, weariness*.

2874. **κοπρία** *kópria*, *kop-ree'-ah*; from **κόπος** *kópos* (*ordure*; perh. akin to **ἀεφ**); *manure*;—*dung* (hill).

2875. **κόπτω** *kóptō*, *kop'-to*; a prim. verb; to "*chop*"; spec. to *beat* the breast in grief;—*cut down, lament, mourn, (be-) wail*. Comp. the base of **ἀεφ**.

2876. **κόραξ** *kórax*, *kor'-ax*; perh. from **ἀεφ**; a *crow* (from its voracity);—*raven*.

2877. **κόρασιον** *kórasion*, *kor-as'-ee-on*, neut. of a presumed der. of **κόρη** *kórē* (a *maiden*); a (little) *girl*;—*damsel, maid*.

2878. **κορβάν** *kórbān*, *kor-ban'*; and

κορβανός *kórbānos*, *kor-ban-as'*; of Heb. and Chald. or. respectively [7188]; a *votive offering* and *the offering*; a *consecrated present* (to the Temple fund); by extens. (the latter term) the *Treasury* itself, i.e. the room where the contribution boxes stood;—*Corban, treasury*.

2879. **Κορέ** *Kórē*, *kor-eh'*; of Heb. or. [7141]; *Corē* (i.e. *Korach*), an *Isr.*;—*Core*.

2880. **κορέννυμι** *kórennumi*, *kor-en'-noo-mee*; a prim. verb; to *cram*, i.e. *glut* or *sate*;—*eat enough, full*.

2881. **Κορινθίος** *Kórinthios*, *kor-in'-thee-os*; from **ἀεφ**; a *Corinthian*, i.e. inh. of Corinth;—*Corinthian*.

2882. **Κορινθός** *Kórinthos*, *kor-in'-thos*; of uncert. der.; *Corinthus*, a city of Greece;—*Corinth*.

2883. **Κορνήλιος** *Kórnelios*, *kor-nay'-lee-os*; of Lat. or.; *Cornelius*, a Roman;—*Cornelius*.

2884. **κόρος** *kóros*, *kor'-os*; of Heb. or. [3734]; a *cor*, i.e. a specific measure;—*measure*.

2885. **κοσμάω** *kósmāō*, *kos-meh'-o*; from **ἀεφ**; to *put* in proper order, i.e. *decorate* (lit. or fig.); spec. to *snuff* (a wick);—*adorn, garnish, trim*.

2886. **κοσμικός** *kósmikos*, *kos-mee-kos*; from **ἀεφ** (in its secondary sense); *terrene* ("cosmic"), lit. (*mundane*) or fig. (*corrupt*);—*worldly*.

2887. **κόσμος** *kósmos*, *kos-mee-os*; from **ἀεφ** (in its prim. sense); *orderly*, i.e. *decorous*;—*of good behaviour, modest*.

2888. **κοσμοκράτωρ** *kósmokratōr*, *kos-mok-rat'-ore*; from **ἀεφ** and **ἀεφ**; a *world-ruler*, an epithet of Satan;—*ruler*.

2889. **κόσμος** *kósmos*, *kos-mos*; prob. from the base of **ἀεφ**; *orderly arrangement*, i.e. *decoration*; by impl. *the world* (in a wide or narrow sense, includ. its inh. or fig. [mor.]);—*adorning, world*.

2890. **Κούαρτος** *Kóuartos*, *koo'-ar-tos*; of Lat. or. (*fourth*); *Quartus*, a Chr.;—*Quartus*.

2891. **κούμη** *kóumi*, *koo'-mee*; of Chald. or. [6966]; *cumi* (i.e. *rise*);—*oumi*.

2892. **κουστώδης** *kóustōdēs*, *koos-to-dee'-ah*; of Lat. or.; "*custody*"; i.e. a Roman *sentry*;—*watch*.

2893. **κουφίζω** *kóuphizō*, *koo-fid'-zo*; from **κούφος** *kóuphos* (*light* in weight); to *unload*;—*lighten*.

2894. **κόφινος** *kóphinos*, *kof-ee-nos*; of uncert. der.; a (small) *basket*;—*basket*.

2895. **κράββατος** *krábbatos*, *krab'-bat-os*; prob. of for. or.; a *mattress*;—*bed*.

2896. **κράξω** *kráxō*, *krad'-zo*; a prim. verb; prop. to "*croak*" (as a raven) or *scream*, i.e. (gen.) to *call* aloud (*shriek, exclaim, intreat*);—*cry (out)*.

2897. **κραπάλη** *krapalē*, *krahee-pal'-ay*; prob. from the same as **γὰρ**; prop. a *headache* (as a seizure of pain) from drunkenness, i.e. (by impl.) a *debauch* (by anal. a *glut*);—*surfeiting*.

2898. **κρανίον** *kranion*, *kran-ee'-on*; dimin. of a der. of the base of **ἀεφ**; a *skull* ("cranium");—*Calvary, skull*.

2899. **κράσπεδον** *krapēdōn*, *kras'-ped-on*; of uncert. der.; a *margin*, i.e. (spec.) a *fringe* or *tassel*;—*border, hem*.

2900. **κραταιός** *kraatios*, *krat-ah-yos*; from **ἀεφ**; *powerful*;—*mighty*.

2901. **κραταίω** *kraatīō*, *krat-ah-yō'-o*; from **ἀεφ**; to *empower*, i.e. (pass.) *increase in vigor*;—*be strengthened, be (wax) strong*.

2902. **κρατέω** *kratēō*, *krat-eh'-o*; from **ἀεφ**; to *use strength*, i.e. *seize* or *retain* (lit. or fig.);—*hold (by, fast), keep, lay hand (hold) on, obtain, retain, take (by)*.

2903. **κράτιστος** *kratistos*, *krat'-is-tos*; superl. of a der. of **ἀεφ**; *strongest*, i.e. (in dignity) *very honorable*;—*most excellent (noble)*.

2904. **κράτος** *kratōs*, *krat'-os*; perh. a prim. word; *vigor* ["great"] (lit. or fig.);—*dominion, might* [-ily], *power, strength*.

2905. **κραυγάζω** *kraugazō*, *krōu-gad'-zo*; from **ἀεφ**; to *clamor*;—*cry out*.

2906. **κραυγή** *kraugē*, *krōu-gay'*; from **ἀεφ**; an *outcry* (in notification, tumult or grief);—*clamour, cry* (-ing).

2907. **κρέας** *krēas*, *kreh'-as*; perh. a prim. word; (*butcher's*) *meat*;—*flesh*.

2908. **κρείσσον** *krēissōn*, *krice-son*; neut. of an alt. form of **ἀεφ**; (as noun) *better*, i.e. *greater advantage*;—*better*.

2909. **κρείττων** *krēittōn*, *krice-tohn*; compar. of a der. of **ἀεφ**; *stronger*, i.e. (fig.) *better*, i.e. *nobler*;—*best, better*.

2910. **κρεμάννυμι** *krēmānumi*, *krem-an'-noo-mee*; a prol. form of a prim. verb; to *hang*;—*hang*.

2911. **κρημνός** *krēmnos*, *krame-nos*; from **ἀεφ**; *overhanging*, i.e. a *precipice*;—*steep place*.

2912. **Κρής** *Krēs*, *krace*; from **ἀεφ**; a *Cretan*, i.e. inh. of Crete;—*Crete, Cretian*.

2913. **Κρήσκης** *Krēskēs*, *krace-kace*; of Lat. or.; *growing*; *Cresces* (i.e. *Crescens*), a Chr.;—*Crescens*.

2914. **Κρήτη** *Krētē*, *kray'-tay*; of uncert. der.; *Cretē*, an island in the Mediterranean;—*Crete*.

2915. **κριθή** *krithē*, *kree-thay'*; of uncert. der.; *barley*;—*barley*.

2916. **κρίθινος** *krithinos*, *kree-thee-nos*; from **ἀεφ**; consisting of *barley*;—*barley*.

2917. **κρίμα** *krima*, *kree'-mah*; from **ἀεφ**; a *decision* (the *function* or the *effect*, for or against ["crime"]);—*avenge, condemn, condemnation, damnation, + go to law, judgment*.

2918. **κρίνον** *krinon*, *kree'-non*; perh. a prim. word; a *lily*;—*lily*.

2919. **κρίνω** *krinō*, *kree'-no*; prop. to *distinguish*, i.e. *decide* (mentally or judicially); by impl. to *try, condemn, punish*;—*avenge, conclude, condemn, damn, decree, determine, esteem, judge, go to (sue at the) law, ordain, call in question, sentence to, think*.

2920. **κρίσις** *krisis*, *kree'-sis*; *decision* (subj. or obj., for or against); by extens. a *tribunal*; by impl. *justice* (spec. *divine law*);—*accusation, condemnation, damnation, judgment*.

2921. **Κρίσπος** *Krispos*, *kris'-pos*; of Lat. or.; "*crisp*"; *Crispus*, a Corinthian;—*Crispus*.

2922. **κριτήριον** *krithērion*, *kree-tay'-ree-on*; neut. of a presumed der. of **ἀεφ**; a *rule* of judging ("criterion"), i.e. (by impl.) a *tribunal*;—*to judge, judgment* (seat).

2923. **κριτής** *krithēs*, *kree-tace'*; from **ἀεφ**; a *judge* (gen. or spec.);—*judge*.

2924. **κριτικός** *krithikos*, *krice-ke-kos*; from **ἀεφ**; *decisive* ("critical"), i.e. *discriminative*;—*discerner*.

2925. **κρούω** *krōō*, *krōo'-o*; appar. a prim. verb; to *rap*;—*knock*.

2926. **κρυπτή** *krupthē*, *kroop-tay'*; fem. of **ἀεφ**; a *hidden place*, i.e. *cellar* ("crypt");—*secret*.
