

3665. ἁμῶσις ἁμῶσις, ἁμ-ω-σι-ς; adv. from 3664; similarly:—likewise, so.

3666. ἁμῶσις ἁμῶσις, ἁμ-ω-σι-ς; from 3666; assimilation, i.e. resemblance:—similitude.

3670. ἁμολογία ἁμολογία, ἁμ-ολ-ογ-ία; from a comp. of the base of 3674 and 3675; to assent, i.e. covenant, acknowledge:—con- (pro-) fession is made, give thanks, promise.

3671. ἁμολογία ἁμολογία, ἁμ-ολ-ογ-ία; from the same as 3670; acknowledgment:—con- (pro-) fession, professed.

3672. ἁμολογούμενος ἁμολογούμενος, ἁμ-ολ-ογ-οῦ-με-νος; adv. of pres. pass. part. of 3670; confessedly:—without controversy.

3673. ἁμείψυχος ἁμείψυχος, ἁμ-οι-ψυ-χ-ος; from the base of 3674 and 3675; a fellow-artist:—of the same craft.

3674. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; gen. of ἁμῶς ἁμῶς (the same; akin to 366) as adv.; at the same place or time:—together.

3675. ἁμείψυχος ἁμείψυχος, ἁμ-οι-ψυ-χ-ος; from the base of 3674 and 3675; like-minded, i.e. harmonious:—of one mind.

ἁμῶς ἁμῶς. See 3666.

3676. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; adv. from the base of 3674; at the same time, i.e. (conj.) notwithstanding, yet still:—and even, nevertheless, though but.

3677. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; of uncert. der.; a dream:—dream.

3678. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; neut. of a presumed der. of 3678; a little ass:—young ass.

ἁμῶς ἁμῶς. See 3666.

3679. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3679; to defame, i.e. rail at, chide, taunt:—cast in teeth, (suffer) reproach, revile, upbraid.

3680. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3679; contumely:—reproach.

3681. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; prob. akin to the base of 3680; notoriety, i.e. a taunt (disgrace):—reproach.

3682. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3682; profitable; Onesimus, a Chr.:—Onesimus.

3683. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from a der. of 3683 and 3684; profit-bearer; Onesiphorus, a Chr.:—Onesiphorus.

3684. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3684; belonging to an ass, i.e. large (so as to be turned by an ass):—millstone.

3685. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; a prol. form of an appar. prim. verb (ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, to stir); for which another prol. form (ἁμῶς ἁμῶς) is used as an alt. in some tenses (unless indeed it be identical with the base of 3686 through the idea of notoriety); to gratify, i.e. (mid.) to derive pleasure or advantage from:—have joy.

3686. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from a presumed der. of the base of 3687 (comp. 3685); a "name" (lit. or fig.) [authority, character]:—called, (+ sur-) name (-ā).

3687. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3687; to name, i.e. assign an appellation; by extens. to utter, mention, profess:—call, name.

3688. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; appar. a prim. word; a donkey:—ass.

3689. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; adv. of the oblique cases of 3689; reality:—certainly, clean, indeed, of a truth, verily.

3690. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3690; vinegar, i.e. sour wine:—vinegar.

3691. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; prob. akin to the base of 3691 ["acid"]; keen; by anal. rapid:—sharp, swift.

3693. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3693; regard; from 3693 with enclitic of source; from the rear (as a secure aspect), i.e. at the back

(adv. and prep. of place or time):—after, backside, behind.

3694. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from the same as 3693 with enclitic of direction; to the back, i.e. aback (as adv. or prep. of time or place; or as noun):—after, back (-ward), (+ get) behind, + follow.

3695. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3695; to equip (with weapons [mid. and fig.]):—arm self.

3696. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; prob. from a prim. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς (to be busy about); an implement or utensil or tool (lit. or fig., espec. offensive for war):—armour, instrument, weapon.

3697. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3697 and 3698; of what kind that, i.e. how (as) great (excellent) (spec. as indef. correl. to antec. def. 3697 of quality):—what manner (sort) of, such as, whatsoever.

3698. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3698 and 3699; what (-ever) then, i.e. (of time) as soon as:—when.

3699. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3699 and 3700; what (-ever) where, i.e. at whichever spot:—in what place, where (-as, -soever), whither (+ -soever).

3700. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; appar. a prim. (mid.) a (mid.) prol. form of the prim. (mid.) ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, which is used for it in certain tenses; and both as alt. of 3700; to gaze (i.e. with wide-open eyes, as at something remarkable; and thus differing from 3701, which denotes simply voluntary observation; and from 3702, which expresses merely mechanical, passive or casual vision; while 3700, and still more emphatically its intens. 3700, signifies an earnest but more continued inspection; and 3700 a watching from a distance):—appear, look, see, shew self.

3701. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from a presumed der. of 3700; visuality, i.e. (concr.) an apparition:—vision.

3702. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from an obsol. verb akin to ἁμῶς ἁμῶς (to "steep"); cooked, i.e. roasted:—broiled.

3703. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; appar. from the base of 3703 and 3704; prop. even-tide of the (summer) season (dog-days), i.e. (by impl.) ripe fruit:—fruit.

3704. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3704 and 3705; what (-ever) how, i.e. in the manner that (as adv. or conj. of coincidence, intentional or actual):—because, how, (so) that, to, when.

3705. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3705; something gazed at, i.e. a spectacle (espec. supernatural):—sight, vision.

3706. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3706; the act of gazing, i.e. (external) an aspect or (intern.) an inspired appearance:—sight, vision.

3707. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3707; gazed at, i.e. (by impl.) capable of being seen:—visible.

3708. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; prop. to stare at [comp. 3700], i.e. (by impl.) to discern clearly (phys. or ment.); by extens. to attend to; by Hebr. to experience; pass. to appear:—behold, perceive, see, take heed.

3709. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3709; prop. desire (as a reaching forth or excitement of the mind), i.e. (by anal.) violent passion (ire, or [justifiable] abhorrence); by impl. punishment:—anger, indignation, vengeance, wrath.

3710. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3710; to provoke or enrage, i.e. (pass.) become exasperated:—be angry (wroth).

3711. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3711; irascible:—soon angry.

3712. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3712; a stretch of the arms, i.e. a fathom:—fathom.

3713. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; mid. of appar. a prol. form of an obsol. prim. [comp. 3713]; to stretch oneself, i.e. reach out after (long for):—covet after, desire.

3714. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3714; mountainous, i.e. (fem. by impl. of 3714) the High-lands (of Judaea):—hill country.

3715. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3715; excitement of the mind, i.e. longing after:—lust.

3716. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from a comp. of 3717 and 3718; to be straight-footed, i.e. (fig.) to go directly forward:—walk uprightly.

3717. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; prob. from the base of 3715; right (as rising), i.e. (perpendicularly) erect (fig. honest), or (horizontally) level or direct:—straight, upright.

3718. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from a comp. of 3717 and the base of 3718; to make a straight cut, i.e. (fig.) to dissect (expound) correctly (the divine message):—rightly divide.

3719. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3719; to use the dawn, i.e. (by impl.) to repair betimes:—come early in the morning.

3720. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3720 and 3721; relating to the dawn, i.e. matutinal (as an epithet of Venus, espec. brilliant in the early day):—morning.

3721. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3721; in the dawn, i.e. up at day-break:—early.

3722. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from the same as 3721; dawn (as sun-rise, rising of light); by extens. morn.:—early in the morning.

3723. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; adv. from 3723; in a straight manner, i.e. (fig.) correctly (also mor.):—plain, right (-ly).

3724. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3724; to mark out or bound ("horizon"), i.e. (fig.) to appoint, decree, specify:—declare, determine, limit, ordain.

3725. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; neut. of a der. of an appar. prim. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς (a bound or limit); a boundary-line, i.e. (by impl.) a frontier (region):—border, coast.

3726. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from 3726; to put on oath, i.e. make swear; by anal. to solemnly enjoin:—adjure, charge.

3732. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; neut. of a presumed der. of 3732; a birding:—bird, fowl.

3733. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; prob. from a prol. form of the base of 3733; a bird (as rising in the air), i.e. (spec.) a hen (or female domestic fowl):—hen.

3734. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; from a comp. of 3734 and a der. of 3666; a limit-placing, i.e. (concr.) boundary-line:—bound.

3735. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; prob. from an obsol. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς (to rise or "rear"); perh. akin to 3735; comp. 3735; a mountain (as lifting itself above the plain):—hill, mount (-ain).

3736. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; appar. a prim. verb; to "burrrow" in the ground, i.e. dig:—dig.

3737. ἁμῶς ἁμῶς, ἁμ-ω-ς; of uncert. affn.; bereaved ("orphan"), i.e. parentless:—comfortless, fatherless.
